

Our Vision: Safe People, Safe Airport, Safe Aircraft Operations

Marlborough Airport is committed to continually improving our policies, procedures, safety learnings, culture and awareness to ensure a safe and secure work environment for staff and visitors and to ensure safe aircraft operations at all times. To underscore this commitment, Marlborough Airport has adopted an all of operations Safety Management System (SMS), which has set the framework, criteria and performance standards.

- **Managing Hazards and Associated Risks**

MAL actively manages the hazards and associated risks to aviation and to people's health and safety by reviewing risk controls and safety goals. MAL is committed to the identification of new hazard and associated risk controls and to minimise residual risks to as low as reasonably practicable (ALARP).

- **Safety Communication: One Airport - One Team**

MAL strives to maintain a continuous learning and improvement philosophy over all airport operations that are within its sphere of influence. MAL promotes a "positive" safety culture through both active safety communication and engagement and an airport wide non-punitive incident and accident reporting culture. Safety incidents, concerns and observations as reported are reviewed and appropriately acted on. If it does not look right; "*Speak Up - Take Action*".

- **Structured and Effective Control**

Our aim is to reduce harm to zero; our Board, airport managers, all employees and contractors at the airport must; contribute to safety, make good decisions, and follow rules and regulations. ACE documentation, procedures and instructions must be complied with at all times.

- **Safety is a Core Responsibility**

The Board and Chief Executive are responsible for the monitoring, performance and functioning of the Airport. They provide the necessary leadership and resources and are engaged with and drive the implementation and performance of the SMS.

- **Compliance**

The means and methods for achieving these goals are set out in the approved Aerodrome Certification Exposition (ACE) that comprises:

1. Safety Management System (SMS) Manual (this manual).
2. Standards and Operating Procedures Manual (SOPs).
3. Aerodrome Emergency Plan (AEP).
